Though it was a bit difficult at first (isn't everything?), after learning where to find the needed information and slowly finding out how it is logically structured, the Private Area of BEST was actually heaven! All the needed functionality grouped together in one system. And I didn't mention yet the little features that make it a people's tool (like the birthday reminder service) rather than a techie's toy. Ok, like every IT system it still has many disadvantages, but when looking back, one is allowed to romanticize...

Hej, wait a minute! Looking back? Does this mean that the *Private Area* is of no use any more for me, BEST Alumni? Yes and no... Most of the functionality is there to provide the active members tools for their achievements. Still for us, the list of (former) BEST members is actually a database that is worth its money... And it's freely accessible! Looking at the high rise that networking websites, like *LinkedIn* or *Xing*, took over the last years, one starts realizing the value of a good personal network. And that is exactly what the

Private Area is for you, as long as the information in there – thus also your profile – is kept up to date.

If you browse a bit longer around, now that you are there, you can see that there the last years plenty of nice little tools were developed. They are focussed on work for BEST, so it's no longer possible for you to use them. But keep your head up; there are plenty of freely available tools on the web that could do the trick for you. **Doodle**, for instance. Instead of sending out a mail to a list of people to find a suitable date for meeting, you could use this tool. This will take the frustration away, which could appear when only two days are left over after the two first replies (typically by the persons with the busiest agendas).

And there are plenty more good and free tools out there. This column might stop with this observation; but a quest for collecting those starts here.
